The tour concludes with a visit to the vibrant Khan El Khalili Bazaar, a centuries-old market filled with a kaleidoscope of colors, scents, and sounds. Wander through narrow alleys lined with shops selling spices, perfumes, handmade jewelry, and traditional crafts. You'll have time to relax in a historic café like El-Fishawy, one of Cairo's oldest, while sipping mint tea and soaking in the timeless ambiance. If you're an enthusiast of history, art, or culture, this comprehensive tour of Islamic Cairo gives you a deep and lasting connection to the heart of Egypt.

Islamic Cairo day Tour

Begin your walking tour of Islamic Cairo with a morning visit to the legendary Citadel of Salah El-Din, perched high above the city. Stop at the beautiful Mosque of Muhammad Ali, or the Alabaster Mosque, and enjoy the panoramic views of Cairo from the citadel terrace. Then walk through the Mosque of Sultan Hassan and the Al-Rifa'i Mosque, two architectural masterpieces that attest to the power and elegance of Mamluk and Ottoman design. Your guide will provide deep historical context, sharing tales about sultans, scholars, and the Islamic dynasties that once ruled from this medieval quarter.

Finish your tour by walking along the old and atmospheric Al-Muizz Street, one of the oldest and most significant streets in Cairo. Along the way, pause at restored treasures such as the Qalawun Complex, Sabil-Kuttab of Katkhuda, and Beit El-Suhaymi, a traditional Ottoman-style house showcasing home life in old Cairo. Break for lunch at a local eatery to enjoy Egyptian staples like falafel, hawawshi, or molokhia. Afterwards, visit the Khan El Khalili Bazaar, a lively marketplace where you can shop for handmade goods, spices, and souvenirs. End the day with a relaxed drink at El-Fishawy Café, Cairo's oldest café, surrounded by centuries of tradition and the vibrant pulse of Islamic Cairo.
