Day 1: Abu Simbel Trip

A remarkable two-day tour in Aswan; from the lobby of your hotel, the certified tour guide will take you on an amazing two-day tour to Abu Simbel and Aswan from Luxor, one of the best in Egypt day tours in Luxor.

You are transferred to Aswan to go fully sightseeing, starting with the visit to the Unfinished Obelisk still lying in the granite quarries in Aswan, the High Dam-near the bank of the Nile in Aswan, built to stop the flooding, and to develop electric power for all edges of Egypt, was completed in 1971; the huge reservoir on the other side, named after the former Egyptian President Nasser, was filled in 1979.

Resume visiting Philae Temple, the majestic Temple of Goddess Isis, the chief goddess of the island, now lying on the Island of Agilika to the south of the old Aswan Dam; then enjoy a felucca boat ride to Nubian Village at the foot of Elephantine Island to learn about the simple and natural life of Nubian local people before transferring you to the hotel in Aswan to check-in and then free time at leisure before spending the night at an Aswan hotel.

Day 2: Abu Simbel Trip

On the second day, you will continue your Abu Simbel tour, and the breakfast box will be prepared by the hotel in Aswan. After this, it is set for one of the striking Egyptian day tours of Abu Simbel, accompanied by your English tour guide and driver to visit the two Temples of Abu Simbel for King Ramses II- a live testament to some of the highest in glory and grandeur in the new kingdom era. Had there not been an international salvage campaign under the supervision of the Egyptian government and UNESCO, these temples would have drowned by now, given the upheaval of water behind the dam.

Nubia was a land so important to Egyptians owing to its gold and numerous other precious trade goods that the king erected grand temples there to impress upon the Nubians Egypt's might and Egyptianize the people of Nubia. The Temple of Ramses II further devoted itself to the four universal gods Ptah, Re-Her-Akhtey, Amun-Re, and Ramses-II himself.

The great Abu Simbel temple is additionally called the Sun Temple of Ramses II. The Temple of Queen Nefertari, the adored wife of King Ramses II, is also called the Temple of Hathor, who is rather symbolic as the wife of the Sun God. So both temples here, that of Ramses and that of Nefertari, bring Ramses II, Nefertari, Hathor, and the Sun God Amun in perfect union.

After that, you will be transferred back to Aswan and proceed to your hotel in Luxor after enjoying some of the best things to do in Luxor.
