These are the most spectacular paintings that have stood the test of time, revealing an aspect of the ancient belief in the afterlife. The next was the great Hatshepsut Temple, the phenomenal mortuary temple cut within the cliffs of Deir el-Bahari and dedicated to the first woman pharaoh of Egypt. Here, too, you can see the Colossi of Memnon, two mighty, stone statues of Amenhotep III, that have for centuries been standing guard.

With this, one can easily complete the tour supplemented by a delicious sunny afternoon break, most probably enjoying a classic Egyptian meal at a neighborhood restaurant on the way back. Whether you are a history enthusiast or a casual traveler, a Luxor Day tour transports you through time with great stories, breathtaking monuments, and unforgettable memories. This trip is bound to deep dive into the wonders of the ancient civilization, as an expert guide will bring down insights from the rich heritage of Egypt.

Tour to Luxor Attractions

Pickup from your hotel begins a full-day Luxor tour of the extraordinary ancient sites of the city. Cross to the West Bank first, where you will explore the Kings' Valleys and the tombs of famous pharaohs like Tutankhamun and Ramses the Great. Gaze upon the stony wall paintings and carvings that illustrate the struggles of the pharaoh toward the afterlife. Nearby is the Temple of Hatshepsut, a mortuary temple built for Egypt's only female pharaoh and resting against the western cliffs of Deir El-Bahari; an incredible edifice. The last stop on the West Bank will be the Colossi of Memnon, the famous statue of Amenhotep III, graciously watching over the valley below.

After a break for lunch, you would move from bank to bank on the East Bank towards the exquisite Karnak Temple, one of the largest temple complexes in the world. Roam through the Great Hypostyle Hall, gazing at the towering column and grandeur of architecture. A stop at Luxor Temple, a striking monument on the banks of the Nile, and dedicated to the gods Amun, Mut, and Khonsu would be the last attraction in the itinerary, where you would witness the beautiful sculptures and the sacred avenue of Luxor Temple. You'll be driven back to your hotel at the end of the day, armed with an arsenal of knowledge and fond memories of Luxor's ancient wonders.
