Not least the absolutely outstandingly preserved Tomb of Queen Nefertari almost apparently comes alive due to exquisite art executed over a few millennia ago. The skilled expert of the tour will treat the tourists to the lives of the fierce regal women, the structure of the place and boreholes in the ground, aye! Hidden secrets... and so much ore. The quantum emphasizes the importance of the role of women in ancient Egypt and the culture of designing their tombs.

Itinerary

West Bank tour to Valley of the Kings and Queens

The adventure starts from your hotel or Nile cruise with a professional Egyptologist guide who will take you for an unforgettable visit to the legendary West Bank of Luxor. Thirty-five to forty minutes' riding by car through the countryside watching the wild animals coming in and going out of small fields on the way will take you to your first destination: the Valley of the Kings. Known as the "secret palace," it is contained inside the mountain areas exactly where many compartments are used for the burial of pharaohs. Different tombs from New Kingdom rulers like Tutankhamun, Ramses VI, and Amenhotep II are wholly preserved from within the rock, which is hidden inside the mountains.

After this, proceed to the real Medinet Habu, the 'mortuary temple' of Ramses III, which is a fine piece of architecture with high mudbrick walls. This was certainly one of the most well-kept temples in Egypt, and it is noteworthy as the site associated with the earliest recorded labor complaint in history. Next comes the Valley of the Queens, which is often denoted as 'The Place of Beauty' for both wives and children of the pharaohs. Visitors will look at three exciting tombs, including the famous tombs of Amun-her-khepeshef, Seth-her-khopsef, and Queen Tyti. You can also include in your package the well-known grave of Nefertari, under an additional admission charge, famous for its unique and vibrant colors.

Take a break from it to enjoy the tantalizing food at the nearby restaurant, the delicate flavors of traditional Egypt at your palettes etc., later you would head to visit the Colossi of Memnon, your final stop. This gateway to a vast mortuary temple enters afore mentioned colossal statues that reflected the grandeur of Egyptian architecture in the olden days.
