Itinerary

Day 1: Enjoyable Sightseeing Tour in Aswan

Today you will start your adventure with the Cairo Top Tours team. One of our tour leaders will pick you up from any hotel, train station, or airport in Aswan to take you to one of the most famous cruises in Egypt. Today you will have the opportunity to visit the most beautiful archaeological city in the world, Aswan, as you will see the largest and most popular temples built on the banks of the Nile. You will meet your tour guide today, who will take you on an unforgettable adventure to the most beautiful pharaonic temples.

Today we will start by visiting the unfinished obelisk, which is one of the most famous wonders of ancient engineering. The obelisk provides a unique insight into the stone-working techniques used by the ancient Egyptians. They used dolerite balls—a type of hard volcanic rock—to pound granite and carve the obelisk with great precision. The marks of these precise tools are still visible on the monument, providing a tangible link to the workers who worked hard on this project thousands of years ago. The size of the unfinished obelisk is truly astonishing. If it had been completed, it would have been about 42 meters high and weighed about 1,200 tons. This would make it the largest obelisk ever erected by the Egyptians, surpassing the Lateran Obelisk in Rome, which currently holds the record.

You will also visit the Temple of Philae. The Philae name comes from the Greek language, meaning "beloved" or "beloved." The famous Arabic name for it is Anas al-Wujud, after the legend of Anas in the stories of the One Thousand and One Nights. The ancient Egyptian and Coptic name for it is Bilak or Bilakh, meaning the limit or the end, as it was the last border of Egypt in the south. The cult complex was dedicated to the worship of the goddess Isis, but the island contained temples to Hathor and Amenhotep, among others. The ruins of the Temple of Philae cover four main periods in Egypt: the last part of the Pharaonic era, the Ptolemaic era, the famous Roman era, and the Christian era.

At the end of the day, you will visit the High Dam, which is the first project to store water in the Nile Basin countries. The number of workers in it reached 34 thousand, and its construction took 10 years, starting from 1960 to 1970, at a cost of about one billion dollars. The International Commission on Dams and Major Corporations ranked it as one of the top projects of the twentieth century. The benefits of its construction were not limited to the agricultural and livestock sectors only, but it had a direct impact on the Egyptian economy in a big way, and its impact was reflected in Egypt's political and regional power and its position in the region.

At the end of the day, we will transfer you to the cruise to enjoy a delicious dinner on board your amazing cruise.

Day 2: Exploration trip to the Temples of Kom Ombo and Edfu

You will start the day with a delicious and healthy breakfast to give you enough energy to start your adventure today. Your private tour guide will come and take you to explore two of the most important Egyptian temples, Kom Ombo and Edfu.

You will visit the dazzling Temple of Kom Ombo, which is characterized by wonderful views and engravings decorating its walls in addition to the beautiful column capitals. On the walls of the temple, you will find a calendar of festivals and other religious activities, along with their dates and associated rituals. During the Roman era, in the 2nd century AD, a scene was engraved showing what are believed to be surgical instruments, demonstrating the sophistication of ancient Egyptian medicine. In the center of the back of the temple, you will see both Sobek and Horus on either side of the temple in a deeply symbolic scene, inspiring ancient devout visitors to this sacred place.

You will also visit the Temple of Edfu, one of the best-preserved temples in Egypt, containing a collection of unique inscriptions and drawings that record important information about the ancient Egyptian language, ancient historical mythology, religious beliefs, and old worship practices. This temple is the second largest temple in ancient Egypt. Construction of the temple began during the old reign of the Great King Ptolemy III Euergetes and was completed during the reign of King Ptolemy XII. The building is a unique monument to ancient religion and architecture, in addition to the bright, bright colors that have a special charm that will captivate your mind.

Day 3: Exciting tour to the Valley of the Kings, Hatshepsut Temple and Memnon Colossi:

Tourists come from all over the world to enjoy the beauty of Luxor and see the most important archaeological landmarks in the world, so after having your delicious breakfast, we will start our tour immediately. You will be met by your professional tour guide, who will introduce you to the history of these temples and the stories of their kings in detail.

You will visit the Valley of the Kings, which is considered one of the most famous and distinctive archaeological sites in the world. The Valley of the Kings is divided into two different valleys, the Eastern and Western. The eastern part is the most famous of them, as the Western Valley contains a small number of tombs. The Valley of the Kings contains a total of more than sixty impressive and distinctive tombs, in addition to twenty incomplete tombs that are no more than pits. This site was carefully chosen to bury the kings to be safe; it is located on the west bank of the Nile because the sun god dies on the western horizon to be reborn, and his youth is renewed on the eastern horizon, and for this reason, the West was associated with funerary concepts, and most of the ancient Egyptian beautiful tombs were located on the west bank of the Nile.

You will also visit the Deir el-Bahari Temple, which is a funerary temple for Queen Hatshepsut, where rituals were performed for her after her death when she turned into the state of the god Osiris. This temple was not only dedicated to her, as the temple included parts dedicated to her father, King Thutmose I, and the famous goddess Hathor, as well as the god Anubis, the god of the underworld. An open cabin was also dedicated to the sky, dedicated to the sun god "Ra Horakhty," and there is a great place dedicated to Amun, at the end of the upper courtyard, on the main axis of the temple; a passage was cut into the mountain ending in the Holy of Holies.

You will also see the two huge statues of Memnon standing as guardians in Thebes since 1350 BC. They were part of the funerary temple of Amenhotep III, the largest of its kind at the time. The temple suffered from the annual floods that submerged the city, leaving the colossal statues isolated. They depict the pharaoh seated with his hands resting on his knees, facing east towards the Nile and the rising sun. The colossi were rediscovered by European travelers in the early modern period. These statues gained widespread attention in the 19th century. The famous Italian explorer Giovanni Battista Belzoni documented them in 19.

At the end of this enjoyable tour, you will be transferred back to your cruise to enjoy a delicious dinner like no other.

Day 4: Tour to the amazing temples of Karnak and Luxor:

You will have a delicious breakfast early in the morning to start your tour of two of the most important temples of Luxor—Luxor and Karnak temples, accompanied by your tour guide from the Cairo Top Tours team. You will start the day with a visit to the Karnak Temples, the largest place of worship in human history. It was named Karnak Temples because it contains 11 temples inside it and not one temple as rumored, and its name in ancient Egyptian civilization was the temples of (Amun-Ra-Sejm-Nath), as it was built to be the most famous house of worship for the sacred triad of Thebes, and this triad consists of the god "Amun" and his wife "Mut" and their son the god "Khun-Su," as the temple in its current form covers an area of ??more than 247 acres, making it the largest and oldest house of worship in the world today.

You will also visit the Luxor Temple, which was not a regular temple like most other ancient Egyptian temples, as it was not built on the eastern or western side of the Nile but was built facing Karnak because the Luxor Temple was the main place for one of the most famous ancient Egyptian religious celebrations when the statues of the gods Amun, his wife Mut and their son the moon god Khonsu were transferred from their temples in Karnak in a grand and grandiose procession to the Luxor Temple so that they could visit the god residing there, Amun-em-Opet, a celebration known as the sacred Opet Festival.

After finishing this incredible tour, we will transfer you to any hotel in Luxor.
