Explore your trip to Aswan, which is home to numerous temples that were constructed on ancient Egyptian territory and still hold mysteries inside its walls and inscriptions. Because of its unique architectural and religious features, the Kom Ombo Temple, which is situated north of the governorate, is one of the most well-known temples.

Enjoy a visit to Esna and learn about the most famous temple there, as the Temple of Khnum is the only remaining of four temples that existed in Esna, three of which are in the northwest of Esna in (Asfun - Kom El-Deir - West Esna), while the fourth was located in the east of Esna (Hella). In 1830, another temple was discovered in Komir, about 10 km southwest of Esna. However, these temples disappeared since the last century, and nothing remains of them except what indicates them, as the French scientist (Champollion) visited the Temple of Esna in 1828 AD and mentioned that he saw inscriptions bearing the name of King Thutmose in this temple.

You will first head to Kom Ombo in a private air-conditioned car with your guide. One of the preferred tours is to go by boat to the Temple of Haroeris and Sobek (Kom Ombo Temple), where you can discover the panel with the surgical tools engraved, designed according to the latest scientific methods used in this field, and placed in the outer courtyard of the temple near the narrow passage where the original engraving is located, with the aim of reducing the crowding and congestion of visitors who stand for hours in front of it to watch the precision of the medical and surgical tools used by the ancient Egyptians, which reflects the extent of scientific progress and medical miracles during that period of time.

This temple was dedicated to the worship of the god Khnum with his wife Menhet-Nebot. As for the god Khnum, he was represented with the head of a ram and the body of a human and is known as the god of pottery or the creator of humans from clay and as Khnum-Ra, Lord of Esna.

As for the goddess Menhet, she was represented with the head of a female lion and the sun disk above her and the body of a female and resembles the goddess Sekhmet in this power.

As for the goddess Nebot, the second wife of Khnum, her name means the lady of the countryside, she was represented in the form of a human in the form of a lady with the sun disk above her head between two horns.
