Our guide will pick you up from your location to take you to the Nubia Museum The Nubia Museum catches the eye in Aswan with a large collection of artefacts displayed in the park, including not only the Pharaonic era but also the Ptolemaic period as well as the beginnings of the Arab conquest.

The museum contains a huge statue of Ramses II as well as a collection of weapons and utensils belonging to the ancient Egyptians. In addition, it also includes a collection of rare photos that record the discovery of antiquities in Egypt since the beginning of the twentieth century when foreign missions set foot on Egyptian soil in search of Pharaonic antiquities. These include photos showing Egypt in 1907, specifically the areas that were targeted by foreign archaeologists.
