The temple served as a house of worship and continues to do so now. But throughout the ages, it has changed in a number of ways. During the Christian era, the hypostyle hall was transformed into a Christian church, and the church's ruins may still be seen today. After then, it was transformed into a mosque, which has been conserved alongside artifacts and remnants of the old temple.

A row of seven pairs of 16-meter-tall papyrus columns stood at the northern end of the temple, which served as an entryway in ancient times. Inside the temple, there is a hall with 32 other columns, in addition to a small hall, a waiting room, a birth room, and the Church of Alexander the Great at its rear. Learn about the history of Luxor Temple through the ages with us.

Spatial and chronological evidence of the Pharaonic culture across the millennia may be found in abundance at Luxor. The Luxor Temple is the most significant of its numerous structures.

Cairo Top Tours will take care of your transportation from your hotel in Hurghada to Luxor, including flights from Hurghada to Luxor. We start your trip to Luxor Temple. Enjoy the engravings on the temple and learn the meaning of the drawings, as the stone speaks like the offering hall in Luxor Temple. Learn about the types of offerings that were presented to the god, as the king allocated land next to or in front of the temple to be planted and gave it to the priests and god of the temple.

The next destination is the Valley of the Kings. Discover who came up with the concept and why, as well as the tomb discoveries and the tale of how the young water-bearer found Tutankhamun's tomb.

Explore the Draa Abu el-Naga area, where you may see and absorb the most recent discoveries that the Egyptian archaeology team is now examining. In 2017, the tomb of the god Amun's goldsmith, Amenemhat, was discovered... In a room within were two sculptures of him, his wife Amunhotep, and their son Nebnefer. Mummies, wooden masks, colorful wooden coffins, over a hundred Ushabti figurines, and a little Ushabti figure with gold flakes were discovered within.

Take pleasure in a trip to Habu. The temples that Ramses III saw while fighting in ancient Syria served as the model for Habu's construction. It was built on 10 acres and was 400 meters long by 200 meters broad. He said that because of the enormous gate known as the Magdal on its outer wall, which is around 17.7 meters high and has two walls—one internal and one external—one of the biggest and most significant fortified temples in ancient Egypt is the Temple of Habu. The temple's walls are covered in many artworks that recount the conflicts. There are many drawings on the walls of the temple that tell the stories of the wars of King Ramses III and stories about the military campaigns he led from Egypt and the enemies he defeated.
