Day 1: Embarkation in Aswan

A Cairo Top Tours guide will welcome you at Aswan's airport or railway station using a sign with your name written on it following your arrival. You begin your Nile cruise from Aswan to Luxor after transferring to the dock using a private air-conditioned car.

Check-in procedures are complete; follow the cabin relaxation phase until you reach the open buffet lunch. The tour of Aswan begins following your check-in procedures.

The High Dam stands as an essential modern engineering feat because it regulates Nile flooding while presenting breathtaking views across Lake Nasser.

Visitors can observe how ancient Egyptians used their technique to create stone carvings for temples and monuments at the Unfinished Obelisk in the granite quarries.

The Philae Temple serves Goddess Isis by employing Greco-Roman architectural elements while resting on Agilkia Island and tracing the story of Osiris and Seth.

The boat provides a chance to watch a fantastic Nubian folkloric show while you enjoy dinner followed by the show for tasting local entertainment.

Welcome drinks together with lunch and dinner make up the included meals.

Day 2: Kom Ombo and Edfu Temples

Your cruise vessel provides an excellent breakfast experience while continuing its journey through the Nile. Today you will visit two remarkable temples in Egypt, starting with Kom Ombo Temple, which holds a divine double dedication to Sobek, the crocodile god, and Haroeris (Horus the Elder), who takes the form of a falcon-headed deity. The Ptolemaic temple stands out with its symmetrical avenue along with its amazing stone reliefs and its intriguing display of preserved crocodiles in the adjacent museum.

Observe Kom Ombo before the return to your ship for a buffet lunch during your journey to Edfu. Travellers reach Edfu Temple by horse-drawn carriage to observe the perfectly preserved temple, which is considered one of Egypt's best examples of such architecture. The significant religious site of Edfu Temple honours Horus as the falcon-headed god through its monumental design, which consists of huge pylons along with detailed carvings and holy chambers that reveal profound ancient Egyptian worship practices.

Sip afternoon tea on board the cruise ship while admiring the views of the Nile during the journey to Esna. The ship offers a special Egyptian Galabeya Party in the evening that features traditional music and entertainment. Spend the evening on board following an outstanding dinner while the vessel remains moored in Esna.

The meals provided during the cruise consist of breakfast and lunch followed by an afternoon tea and dinner service.

Day 3: Luxor Sightseeing Tours

The pleasure of breakfast will welcome you and your cruise at Luxor while you approach. You should prepare for an essential West Bank tour through Luxor, which offers visitors a remarkable collection of ancient archaeological landmarks.

People can exit their boat at the Valley of the Kings to view pharaoh tombs used during the New Kingdom period. You will encounter spectacular decorated tombs at this site, including those belonging to Ramses II along with Thutmose III as well as the unopened tomb of the famous Tutankhamun, which was discovered in 1922.

The Temple of Queen Hatshepsut stands as an amazing architectural marvel because its designers chose to carve it into the cliffs at Deir el-Bahari to honour one of Egypt's strongest female leaders. You will experience awe when you see the Colossi of Memnon, which were originally positioned to protect the mortuary temple of Pharaoh Amenhotep III.

The ship will serve an exquisite meal, which gives you enough time to proceed to explore East Bank Luxor before returning to the boat. You should visit Karnak Temple Complex, which contains grand halls and towering columns that surround sacred shrines dedicated to the gods. Your Luxor experience should culminate at the Luxor Temple, which both pharaohs and Alexander the Great enhanced before them after they built it on the riverbanks.

You will have a nourishing dinner on the boat while enjoying relaxing time during another night on the Nile.

The boat serves breakfast, lunch, and dinner meals to its guests.

Day 4 : Disembarkation

Your 4-day Nile cruise journey will reach its end with breakfast service followed by departure at board on the last day. The Cairo Top Tours guide will handle your transportation from the cruise to your desired destination between Luxor Airport and railway station or preferred hotel.
