To learn more about how the [Great Pyramids of Giza](#) were built, travel back in time approximately 200 years before the time of King Cheops, the owner of the Great Pyramid of Giza, whose fame continues to amaze scientists. Our [Cairo Day Tours](#) include a visit to the sacred necropolis of the ancient Egyptian capital of the Old Kingdom. Look out for the first perfectly shaped Red Pyramid and the [Bent Pyramid](#) at Dahshur, then the pyramid of Snefru, also known as the Meidum Pyramid, and look out for the most beautiful structures built nearly 4,700 years ago to perpetuate the names of the kings and rulers of ancient Egypt who founded the golden age of Egyptian history.

Visit the Giza Necropolis to see the Great Pyramids of Cheops, Chephren, and Mycerinus, as well as [the Great Sphinx](#), a fantastic lion-like animal with a human head, and the Valley Temple of King Khafra, where the process of mummification took place as part of the funeral rituals. Lunch will be served throughout the [Egypt Day Tours](#) or at the end of your Cairo Trips. On a private day trip from Cairo, join a tour guide to Memphis, Dahshur.

The Egyptian Museum in Cairo has a large collection of artifacts and antiquities dating back to ancient Egypt and beyond.

This tour offers an exciting and comprehensive opportunity to explore the unique wonders of Egypt, from the famous Pyramids of Giza to [the Red Pyramid](#) and the Pyramid of Meidum. This tourist experience takes you on a journey through the rich history of this magical country.

Half Day Tour to Memphis and Dahshur | Cairo Excursions

We will begin our half-day tour by meeting and greeting you at your hotel. Then, an experienced tour guide from Cairo Top Tours will meet you at your hotel. The guide will give you an introduction to your half-day tour

The first destination of the tour will be Dahshur, where you can explore three royal pyramids, including the Red Pyramid of King Senefru, which is known for its dusty reddish color and is considered the first true pyramid in history. The pyramid also features the pharaoh's burial chamber. You will also get to see the Bent Pyramid, which has a distinct appearance due to its leaning sides caused by a construction error.

Our journey will continue towards the ancient city of Memphis, located approximately 40 kilometers to the south of Cairo. We plan to visit the open-air museum that contains various historical artifacts, including the alabaster sphinx, the second-largest sphinx statue in the world, composed of eighty tons of marble, and the colossal statue of Ramses II that has fallen over time. This museum also exhibits priceless masterpieces and artifacts from the former capital of the Pharaohs of ancient Egypt.

After completing your Egypt Day Tours, a tour guide who is a professional will bring you back to your hotel.

The Half Day Tour to Memphis and Dahshur typically commences at a time between 7 and 11 AM, regardless of the specific time of day.
