First, your personal driver and guide will accompany you to visit the <u>Colossi of Memnon</u> which are two colossal statues representing <u>King Amenhotep III</u> seated and having his hands resting on his knees facing East towards the <u>Nile River</u>, the temple of <u>El Deir El Bahri</u> (the Mortuary Temple of Queen <u>Hatshepsut</u>) which is cut into the mountain and was built by the Queen who was the Pharaoh in Egypt 150 centuries ago, it was used as her mortuary temple and the inspiration for the design was taken from another neighboring mortuary temple of Neb-Hept-Re of the twelfth Dynasty.

Enjoy a gourmet lunch meal in one of the best local good quality restaurants in Luxor before proceeding to the Valley of the Kings which contains more than 62 tombs cut by the kings of the New Kingdom from the reign of Tuthmosis of the 18th dynasty, and during the 19th dynasty and the 20th dynasty as well. The Valley of the Kings got its popularity after the discovery of the tomb of the golden king Tutankhamun. At the end of your Luxor excursions, you will visit the Temple of Medinet Habu, which is the necropolis of western Thebes (Luxor nowadays) in Upper Egypt, built by King Ramses III and Deir El Madina or the worker's village where all the artisans and the craftsmen who participated in decorating the tombs at the Valley of the Kings used to live until their death, as the area of the necropolis was considered a secret to keep it away from the tomb robbers.

Now, after you complete your <u>Luxor Sightseeing tours</u>, you will be transferred back to your hotel or any preferred drop-off location within <u>Luxor</u>.
