Day 1- Arrival to Cairo

Our representative will take care of all the paperwork and baggage checks at Cairo International Airport, and then escort you to your hotel for check-in. We'll pick you up from your hotel later that evening for a festive

dinner cruise on the Nile River. After dinner, we'll take you to a lively belly dance performance with a traditional folkloric band. You'll be able to enjoy your Christmas vacation in Egypt to the fullest!

Day 2: Discover the Magical Pyramids

After breakfast, go off with your personal tour guide on your 15-day Egypt Christmas holiday to visit some of the top Cairo tourist attractions. This includes enjoying some of the top Cairo tourist attractions such as the pyramids, Luxor Temple, and the Citadel.

The [Giza Pyramids](#) Complex is a stunning collection of ancient structures that date back 2400 years. The Valley Temple, a colossal sphinx, three larger pyramids, and six lesser ones are all part of this impressive complex. The construction of this impressive monument was carried out during the fourth dynasty, long ago.

The Giza Great Pyramid is one of the Seven Wonders of the Ancient World, and it's the oldest and largest of the three pyramids on the Giza plateau. It took 20 years to build, and it required 2,300,000 stones. It's a massive achievement, and it's an incredible testament to the skills and craftsmanship of the ancient Egyptians.

the great [Sphinx](#) which is 73 metres long, 19 metres wide, and 20 metres tall, belonged to "King Chephren" and is the oldest and largest statue in the whole world. It is an incredible piece of art that is over 3,000 years old.

There is only one remaining Ancient Egyptian granite funeral structure on the Giza plateau used for mummification, located in the [Valley Temple](#).

After enjoying a delicious lunch at a restaurant with a stunning view of the Pyramids or the Nile, why not continue your day with a fascinating trip to one of Egypt's many other attractions?

The pyramid at Saqqara is one of the earliest significant cut stone structures and dates back to the time of Egyptian King Djoser in the 27th century BC. The pyramid is 62 metres tall and is constructed of six steps placed on top of one another, making it an impressive and iconic sight.

The city of Memphis has played an important role in Egyptian history, serving as the country's first capital and preserved a unique position between Upper and Lower Egypt. The god of creation and the arts, Ptah, is said to have watched over [Memphis](#).

Then we'll transfer you back to your hotel for overnight

Day 3 : cairo day tours

After picking you up from your accommodation, our tour guide transfers you to see:

The Egyptian Museum A wonderful collection of artwork from the last 5000 years may be seen at the [Egyptian Museum](#). In addition to an exhibit featuring Tutankhamen's wealth, gold, and jewellery collection, which were preserved in his tomb for more than 3,500 years, there are about 250,000 actual pieces on show.

Before going to: a local Cairo restaurant will give lunch.

Salah El Din Citadel Magnificent in size, Cairo [Salah El Din Citadel](#) was Egypt's administrative hub until the 1860s. It was constructed under Salah Al-rule. Din's The structure was started in 1176 and completed in 1182.

Mohamed Ali Mosque

The majority of the walls of the mosque, which was constructed between 1820 and 1838, were made of pure alabaster, thus its nickname "The Alabaster Mosque." The Blue Mosque in Istanbul is imitated in the [Muhammad Ali Mosque](#).

Market Khan El Khalili The oldest and most known market in the Middle East, [Khan El-Khalili](#), must be visited on every trip to Cairo. Around 970 AD, the same year Cairo was established, it was constructed.

At the end of the day, we'll return you to your Cairo hotel where you may spend the night.

Day 4: Cairo to Luxor / East Bank of Luxor Tour

Check out of your lodging after breakfast, then drive to the Cairo airport to catch a flight to Luxor. There, you'll meet your Egyptologist tour guide and continue your Egypt Christmas vacation by viewing the city's famous attractions, starting with:

Karnak Temple

The most breathtaking location in Egypt is the [Karnak temple](#). It is the largest temple complex in the world. It is the result of numerous generations of Pharaohs and ancient builders. Over 247 acres of land, there are three main structures that make up the Temple of Karnak.

Before travelling with your tour guide to view the Luxor Temple at night, you should transfer to your Nile cruise for lunch and some downtime.

The Temple of Luxor

The Opet Festival, which was the most important celebration, was centred on the [Temple of Luxor](#). The temple served as a location for festival ceremonies and was mostly constructed by Amenhotep III and King Rameses II. The purpose of the celebration was to bring the ruler's heavenly and human aspects into harmony.

For the evening, return to your Luxor Nile cruise.

Day 5: West Bank of Luxor/ Edfu

After breakfast aboard the Yournile Cruise, your Egypt Christmas holiday will come to an end with a visit of the significant sites on Luxor's west bank, including:

[Valley of the Kings](#)

The tombs of famed pharaoh Ramses II and youthful pharaoh Tutankhamen are among those found there, which serves as the final resting place for Egypt's monarchs from the 18th to the 20th dynasties. All the material goods that a king may desire in the afterlife were present in abundance in the tombs. The majority of the burial decoration has survived.

[The Hatshepsut Temple](#)

One of Ancient Egypt's most spectacular and well-preserved temples is this one. The three floors of Hatshepsut's temple were connected by two substantial ramps in the middle.

[colossi of Memnon](#)

The only remaining pieces of a complete burial temple are two enormous stone statues of King Amenhotep III. Pieces of the quartzite sandstone were discovered near Cairo and were carried 700 kilometres to Luxor to be used in the sculptures.

Take a break for lunch and stay the night on your Nile cruise.

Day 6 : Visit Edfu and Kom Ombo Temples

You will enjoy breakfast on board the cruise in the morning before departing for:

[The Kom Ombo Temple](#)

A temple that faces the Nile is the Kom Ombo Temple. There are two separate temples within this one, each with its own hypostyle halls, sanctuaries, and entrances.

Continue travelling to:

Edfu Temple

Dedicated to the Egyptian deity Horus. The Edfu Temple is the best-preserved Greco-Roman structure in Egypt, and on its walls is a "Play" that shows Horus defeating the evil god Seth.

after lunch sail to Aswan and Spend the night on board

Day 7 -: Aswan Sightseeing tour

Start your Aswan day tours after enjoying a delicious breakfast on board your Nile cruise, one of the most highly recommended Egypt Nile Cruises.

High Dam at Aswan:

Start with touring the beautiful Aswan High Dam, one of the most significant construction projects in contemporary Egypt.

The incomplete obelisk

You will next be taken to view the largest unfinished obelisk in Egypt, which is located in Aswan's granite quarries.

Spend as much time as you like seeing the historical places before being transferred back to your Nile Cruise.

Day 8: Disembarkation/ Fly Back to Cairo

At morning after breakfast, we will check out and first we will visit

[The Abu Simbel temples](#)

The two Temples of Abu Simbel are thought to be the best structures from ancient Egypt due to their distinctive architecture. The Temples were built by King Ramses II circa 1200 B.C. as rock-cut temples. King Ramses II is honoured in the first temple, while his devoted wife Queen Nefertari is honoured in the second. Both temples are beautifully decorated with sculptures and artwork. This temple is a must-visit because of its intricately hand-carved pillars, statues, sculptures, and wall paintings.

then, You travel to the airport in Aswan after breakfast to catch a flight to Cairo. Transfer to your accommodation from Cairo airport. (just for breakfast)

Day9 : fayoum day tour

Obtain a morning pick-up from your Cairo hotel to start your journey. Your private guide and you will ride in a cosy, air-conditioned vehicle to the Fayoum Oasis. Discover the Fayoum Oasis's arid lagoons and ancient temple ruins. Admire Wadi Al Rayan's waterfalls.

In Cairo, get in a private van at your hotel. Drive leisurely 105 kilo metres southwest of Cairo to Fayoum. Arrive in the arid oasis of Fayoum Oasis and enjoy the birds at [Quaroun Lake](#). Explore the Fayoum Museum's collection of sculptures and Roman portraits to learn more about the ancient city of Karanis.

After your tour, pause for lunch. Visit the Wadi Al Rayan environmental area, which is renowned for its animals, Quaroun Lake, and springs. Take some pictures of Egypt's biggest waterfall. Take a ride aboard a felucca, a typical wooden sailboat. As your driver returns you to your hotel in Cairo, complete your trip.

Day10: Fly to Sharm El Sheikh

You will be driven from the hotel to [Cairo International Airport](#) after each morning's breakfast so you can catch a flight to Sharm El Sheikh, Egypt's breathtaking seaside resort city. Our agents will meet you at the airport in Sharm El Sheikh and help you check into the hotel so you can spend the rest of the day relaxing and enjoying the sea, sun, and nighttime entertainment. Lunch and dinner buffet items will be served in the hotel's main restaurant.

Day11 : Sharm El Shiekh Optional Excursions

Spend a free day in Sharm or sign up for our optional tour to The Monastery of St. Catherine, which is situated in Sinai's historic centre and is accessible by foot from Mount Sinai's Gebel Musa. This is where Moses received the Ten Commandments. The Greek Orthodox Church owns and operates the Saint Catherine monastery, which is surrounded by gardens and cypress trees.

After the Vatican, this huge library is home to the second-largest collection of illuminated manuscripts in the world. The Burning Bush and several old works of art, including priceless icons, exquisitely carved doors, lovely wall murals, and other magnificent religious embellishments, are visible.

Day 12: Sharm El Shiekh Optional Excursions

Enjoy a peaceful morning of free time. Or, at 2:00 PM, take a free tour. Pickup from your accommodation and a 15-minute in [Sharm El Sheikh day tours](#) will take you to the Quad Bike Center. Start the Quad Bike journey after receiving brief safety and operating instructions.
