The cruise from <u>Egypt tours packages</u> includes guided trips to the Aswan High Dam, the Temple of Philae, the Temple of Kom Ombo, the Temple of Edfu, the Valley of the Kings, the Colossi of Memnon, and the Temple of Hatshepsut, trips that stop at the Luxor Temples and the Karnak Temple on the east bank of Luxor.

Itinerary

Day 1: Embarkation - Aswan Nile Cruise Tours

Your 4-day Roya Ruby Nile Cruise from Aswan to Luxor will depart from the Aswan airport or train station, where our representative will welcome you. Transportation will be provided in a luxury air-conditioned car. Before lunch, you will board the boat to begin your Aswan excursions to the Aswan High Dam, which was built in 1960 to defend Egypt from the yearly Nile River floods. Continue your Aswan sightseeing by going to the <u>Unfinished Obelisk</u>, which is renowned for the red granite that was used to build many renowned structures, including the pyramid of Mycerinus and the Valley Temple of King Chephren, which you can see while taking a tour of the <u>Giza Pyramids</u> The most well-known obelisk commemorates <u>Queen Hatshepsut</u>, the first woman to reign Egypt in its whole history. She was the wife of King Tuthmosis II and one of the queens who ruled Egypt in the 18th dynasty during the new kingdom period of ancient Egyptian history. There is currently no evidence to support the theory that this obelisk is related to <u>Queen Nefertiti</u>, the wife of King Akhenaten.

Then visit the <u>Philae Temple</u>, which honors the goddess of magic, Goddess Isis, and is situated on the island of Agilika after being relocated from Philae Island due to the construction of the High Dam, while continuing your Aswan sightseeing trip. Transfer back to the cruise ship and take pleasure in your meal and the captain's welcome drink.

Food: Lunch and Dinner

Day 2: Kom Ombo and Edfu Temples

Before beginning your tour of the <u>Kom Ombo Temple</u> of Sobek, have your breakfast on board the cruise ship. This remarkable structure is fully symmetrical and has two entrances, two hypostyle halls, and two shrines. This is due to the fact that it is dedicated to two ancient Egyptian deities: Sobek, the local crocodile-headed deity and one of the wicked characters in ancient Egyptian mythology, is worshipped in the temple on the right, while the falcon god Haroeris is honored on the left side. While traveling to <u>Edfu</u>, the cruise liner served lunch.

The Temple of Edfu is the best-preserved Egyptian temple and was once known as the House of Ra, the father of all gods during the Pharaonic era. It is devoted to the god Horus, the son of Osiris and defender of the monarchy. Dinner will be served on board as you cruise near Luxor.

Day 3: Luxor East Bank Tours

Breakfast in the morning on the elegant Royal Ruby Nile Cruise. After lunch, explore the Luxor Temple, which was constructed during the New Kingdom. It was primarily constructed by two of the greatest pharaohs in ancient Egyptian history, Amenhotep III (who built the inner section) and <u>Ramses II</u> (who finished the temple), and it was connected to the Karnak Temple by a sphinx avenue. Continue your Luxor east bank tours by going to the Karnak Temple, which was the most important place of worship in ancient Egypt, particularly under the New Kingdom. As with other Egyptian temples, other deities were also present and have been worshiped in addition to the deity Amun, whose devotion was the focus of the principal temple.

Dinner on the cruise ship and a night in Luxor are included.

Breakfast, lunch, and dinner

Day 4: Disembarkation - Luxor West Bank Tours

Take pleasure in your final breakfast on board the five-star Royal Ruby Nile. After disembarking, you may begin your thrilling Luxor west bank tours by going to the <u>Valley of the Kings</u>, where the pharaohs were interred during the New Kingdom. As opposed to the old kingdom pharaohs who chose to be buried inside enormous constructions the Greeks termed (Pyramids), the kings of the 18th, 19th, and 20th dynasties were interred in rock-cut tombs abandoned away from the eyes of the robbers here.

Transfer to the incredible Temple of Hatshepsut for a tour of the one-of-a-kind temple built by <u>Queen</u> <u>Hatshepsut</u>, who ruled Egypt during the 18th dynasty, Given that it was constructed by her boyfriend, renowned architect Senmout, it is the most magnificent structure in the valley and the only one of its sort in all of Egypt.

The Colossi of Memnon, two enormous colossal statues of <u>King Amenhotep III</u>, are your next stop. They are situated on the west bank of the Nile, close to Medinet Habu and south of the enormous Theban necropolis. Our services will thereafter be concluded after the transfer to the airport, railway station, or other desired drop-off point inside Luxor.
