Itinerary

Day 1: Karnak, and Luxor Temples

Your hotel in Luxor, the train station, or our representative will take you up. You will then be driven to MS Radamis in a private air-conditioned van. Lunch is given on board the Nile cruise, and your tour guide will take you to see the most well-known temples in Luxor and <u>Karnak temple</u>. The Luxor Temples are a significant ancient Egyptian temple complex that dates back to 1400 BC. They are situated on the eastern bank of the Nile in the city that is now known as <u>Luxor</u>. Visit the temple either at opening to avoid the crowds or later at sunset to see the glowing stones.

After supper, go back to your Nile cruise and spend the night there in Luxor.

Day 2: Luxor West Bank Day Tour

Afterwards, our tour guide will take you to explore the west bank of Luxor, where you will see the Valley of the Kings, the temple of <u>Queen Hatshepsut</u> at El Deir El Bahari, and the Colossi of Memnon. Breakfast is served on board the MS Radamis I Nile cruise. Two enormous stone statues of Pharaoh <u>Amenhotep III</u>, who governed Egypt in the dynasty beginning in 1350 BC, are known as the Colossi of Memnon. In the Greco-Roman era, the Colossi of Memnon were already a popular tourist destination.

After supper, go back to your Nile cruise and spend the night there in Luxor.

Day 3: Edfu & Kom Ombo sightseeing

On the MS Radamis I Nile cruise, enjoy breakfast before being taken by our tour guide to see the splendor of the <u>Edfu</u> temple. The Temple of Horus (Edfu Temple), which was constructed between 237 and 57 BC, is one of Egypt's most well-preserved historical sites. preserved by the sand of the desert.

After lunch, we board again and head to Aswan to see <u>Kom Ombo temple</u>. In the Aswanian city of Kom Ombo, there is a peculiar twin temple called Kom Ombo.

Day 4: Aswan Day Tour

On the MS Radamis I Nile cruise, you can enjoy breakfast before being taken by our tour guide to explore the <u>High Dam</u>, the Unfinished Obelisk, and the Great Temple of Philae. The last temple constructed in the traditional Egyptian architecture was the Great <u>Philae Temple</u>, which was constructed to honor the <u>Goddess</u> Isis. Around 690 B.C., construction on it commenced.

After that, go back to your Nile cruise and spend the night there in Luxor.

Day 5: Final departure

The MS Radamis I Nile cruise will serve breakfast before final transporting you to the <u>Aswan airport</u>, train station, or motels.
