Itinerary

Day 1: Arrival to Cairo

Cairo Airport: A member of our staff will meet you there and transport you in an air-conditioned vehicle to your hotel. Overnight in Cairo

Day 2: Pyramids - Memphis - Sakkara

After having your breakfast

After your breakfast, you will visit <u>The Great Pyramids</u> of Cheops, Chephren, Mykerinos, and <u>Sphinx</u>. A camel ride is an option for the trip. Enter the Solar boat and third pyramid, which are also nearby.

The Step Pyramids of Zoser are the oldest significant stone construction in the world. They were built by King Djoser during the third dynasty (about 2630 BC).

After the people had moved to <u>Memphis</u>, which was established by King Menes and served as the first capital of Egypt for more than three thousand years, during the Old Kingdom, you will stop in Dahshur to see the Red Pyramid and the Bent Pyramid. Once you have arrived in Cairo, you will spend all your night there.

Day 3: Azhar and Islamic Sites Tour

After your tasty breakfast, you will be picked up by our Cairo top tour guide at the hotel. Make your destination El Azhar, the earliest Islamic university. Continue on to Al Mouayyed Mosque, Bab Zuweila, which was constructed under Badr Al Dein Al Gamal's direction. After passing the greatest Al Hussein Mosque, turn left onto Beit El Sehimy, a distinctive Islamic home. Continue on foot to Bab al Fetouh and Bab Al Nasr, which were constructed under the direction of Gawhar El Sakaly. Finally, visit the Khan el-Khalili market. Return to your accommodation over your night.

Day 4: Islamic & Coptic Cairo Tour , Dinner Cruise

After breakfast, head to the magnificent <u>Salah El Din Citadel</u>, where the Mohamed Ali Alabaster Mosque is located, to start your tour. After that, visit the <u>Ibn Tulun Mosque</u>, the Gair Anderson Museum, and <u>Old Cairo</u> to see the Roman fortress, <u>the Hanging Church</u> (also called the Al Moaallaka Church), and St. Sergius, who guarded the holy family. Make sure to go on a Nile cruise that includes dinner and cultural entertainment in the evening. Finally, you'll make your way back to your Cairo hotel for the night.

Day 5: Luxor ,Embarkation – Light Show at Karnak

Tasty Breakfast. to catch a flight to Luxor after the transfer. Arrival, followed by transport to the cruise. Embarkation. On board lunch.

visit the Karnak temples for the evening Sound & Light awesome performance. Sleep in Luxor.

Day 6 : Luxor East Bank tour

a meal served while sailing. Visit the Luxor Temple to see the granite sculptures created by Ramses the Great and the courtyard. Visit Karnak, which is home to a number of temples built at various times. Explore the Hypostyle Hall with its 134 enormous columns, the Unfinished Propylon, the Obelisks of Queen Hatshepsut and Temples of Tutomosis III, the Temple of Amon with its papyrus and lotus decorations, the Granite Scarbeus of Amenophis III, the Sacred Lake, and more after passing through the Avenue of Sphinxes. Visit the Museum of Luxor. going back to the cruise Travel to Esna. Lunch and dinner are served on board. Sleepover in Esna.

Day 7: Esna - Edfu.

Visit the Esna Temple. Visit the Temple of Horus at Edfu after sailing there. Lunch is served aboard as like meal. Reach Kom Ombo via sea. Evening tea. Disco Night. Sleep in Kom Ombo.

Day 8: Kom Ombo

Breakfast. Reach Kom Ombo by sea. Visit the Kom Ombo Temple. Lunch is served aboard. Navigate to Edfu. Evening tea. Meal served aboard. Aswan, spend the night.

Day 9: Aswan Tour

a meal served on board. Navigate to Aswan. Visit The huge <u>High Dam</u>, which was finished in 1964, to begin your trip. You can look over <u>Lake Nasser</u> from here. The Agilkian island is reached by speedboat from <u>the Philae temple</u>, the great Temple of Isis, and associated monuments were constructed. Aswan, spend the night.

Day 10: Abu Simbel Tour

a meal served on board. A/C vehicle departure for the Temples of <u>Abu Simbel</u> excursion. One of the wonders of ancient Egyptian architecture is the enormous Temple of Abu Simbel. The temples were cut out of a sandstone rock cliff and had enormous facades with carvings of the gods to which each was devoted.

Tasty Lunch on board. Afternoon Tea. Dinner on board. Games Party. All Over the Night in Aswan.

Day 11: Hot-air Balloon Ride - Luxor West Bank Tour

a meal served while sailing.

Hot ballooning is the best option if you want to add some uniqueness to your time in Luxor. passing gently over the Valley of the Kings, the Valley of the Queens, and the Mountain of the Nobles.

The duration of the flight is approximately 30:45 minutes, depending on the weather.

visit to the Necropolis of Thebes. Drive across the Nile to the Valley of Kings to see King Tut's tomb as well as those of other dynasties. the Temple of Deir El Bahari. On the way back, stop at the Colossi of Memnon, two enormous statues of Amenopis III sitting and looking towards the Nile. On the ship, lunch. afternoon tea. served aboard the ship. Disco Evening. Sleep there the night.

Day 12: Dandara and Abydos, Cairo

a meal served while sailing. Disembarkation. Our guide will pick you up from the Luxor cruise to take you to the historical sites. First, go to Abydos, where the Egyptians believed the deity (Lord of the underworld) was interred. King Seti I started construction on the temple, also known as the Seti I temple, and King Ramses II completed it.

It is located in Abydos City, in the Sohag Government, 135 kilometers from Luxor and 420 kilometers south of Cairo.

Murals depicting the Gods and pharaohs can be seen on the walls of the Osiris Temple in Abydos, one of Egypt's most exquisitely preserved art forms. Continue on to Dandara and visit the shrine to the goddess of joy there. likewise, Hathor. Cairo, North of Luxor, at Dandara, is where you might find the temple.

Arrival in Cairo, flight departure, and hotel transfer. Overnight in Cairo

Day 13: Shopping Tour & Sound and Light show at Giza

You can have a delicious breakfast in your hotel room before embarking on a food tour of Egypt, <u>Cairo day tour</u> offers specialized food and beverage tours for visitors who want to experience the authentic Egyptian culture and try out local dishes at restaurants frequented by locals. They have pre-planned tours available, but they can also create personalized tours anywhere in Egypt.

Your food tour will take you to off-the-beaten-path locations, such as the El Ghorya market in Fatimid Cairo and the historic Bab Zuwayla neighborhood with its busy market, El Mosky. You'll also get to visit Khan el Khalili, the oldest and most prestigious Middle Eastern building, which overlooks narrow alleys filled with traders and their wares.

In the evening, you can head to <u>the Pyramids</u> to witness the Sound & Light performance before spending the night in Cairo. At the end of the tour, a representative will take you back to your accommodation.

Day 14: Alexandria Tour

After having breakfast, you will be picked up by a driver from your hotel to begin your tour of Alexandria. Once you arrive, you will meet your tour guide and start by visiting the Catacombs, which is the largest Roman cemetery consisting of three levels carved out of rock. Next, you'll head to Pompey's Pillar, built in honor of Emperor Diocletian at the end of the 4th century.

You'll also get to see the famous <u>Lighthouse</u>, one of the seven wonders of the ancient world, which is situated at the same location as the Qaitbey fortress. Another stop on the tour will be <u>the Abbo Elabbas Mosque</u>, the largest and most beautiful mosque in Alexandria, dedicated to unknown military personnel.

At the end of the tour, you will return to your hotel and spend the night in Alexandria. You'll travel in a comfortable, air-conditioned car throughout the day.

Day 15: Free Day in Alexandria

After breakfast, your guide will pick you up from your hotel to start your tour of Alexandria. The first stop will be at the Roman Amphitheater, which houses an exhibition of the city's submerged monuments found beneath the East Harbor.

Next, you'll visit the famous Alexandria Library, which boasts of 8 million books and is the largest library in the world. You'll have the opportunity to check out the reading room during your visit.

You'll then proceed to Farouk's Royal Gardens, where you'll see the royal palaces of Haramlek and Salamlek, as well as the royal beaches of the queens. King Farouk, the last king of Egypt, once resided here. You'll also visit St. Mark's Church, the oldest church in Africa.

A drive along the Cornish for 30 kilometers will give you a stunning view of the entire city of Alexandria from the sea. You'll also stop at the famous Stanley modern landmark of Alexandria, visit the old downtown, and take a stroll through the old city center to experience the real cold city of Alexandria that Alexander the Great built.

At the end of the tour, you'll be taken back to your hotel in Alexandria, where you'll spend the night. You'll travel in style throughout the day.

Day 16: Rosetta Tour

After breakfast, your guide will pick you up from your hotel and drive you 60 miles from Alexandria to Rosetta. Here, you'll experience the city's modest way of life. Upon arrival, you'll board a motorboat and sail along the Nile, where you'll see the point where the Nile and the Mediterranean meet. You'll also see the fortress where the Rosetta Stone was discovered in 1799.

During the boat ride, you'll also get to see several Islamic sites. After the boat ride, you'll return to your hotel in Alexandria in luxury. Rosetta has a lot to offer, so if you have any specific interests, let your guide know, and they'll make the necessary arrangements for you. You'll spend the night in Alexandria.

Day 17: El Alamein Tour

After breakfast, your guide will pick you up from your accommodation to start your full-day tour of Alamain. The first stop will be at the Alamain War Museum, where you'll learn about the history of the conflict and see various weaponry and uniforms used by the soldiers of the participating forces.
