Itinerary

Day 1: Arrival day

Our experienced Egypt tour guide will collect you from the <u>Cairo International Airport</u> and take you straight to your hotel in Cairo in a private air-conditioned car so that plans can be made for the next day's excursion.

Meals: lunch and a welcome drink.

Day 2: Pyramids, Egyptian Museum

The <u>Giza Pyramids</u> tour is followed by breakfast, located in Giza, Egypt, are a marvel of craftsmanship and height, with a total construction weighting 6 million tons and 231 meters tall. The pyramids, which weigh 2.5 tons each, are home to the <u>Sphinx</u>, the mythological protector of a massive burial complex, featuring King <u>Chephren</u>'s head and the body of a lion. Visitors can also experience the Sphinx's presence in the Egyptian city.

Every visitor receives a full lunch at a nearby restaurant in between appointments; beverages are not provided.

Afterward, we're going to the <u>Egyptian Museum</u>. One of the valuable treasures in the museum's unequaled collection is the Narmer Stela, which honors the unification of Upper and Lower Egypt under a single monarch. It is housed among the Treasures of Tanis, Psusennes I, and the funeral collection of Yuya and Thuya. This museum has a unique collection that includes decorations and coffins in addition to a large collection of papyri.

Return once more to spend the night.

Meals: Breakfast, Lunch.

Day 3: White desert

After breakfast, your tour guide will come to your Cairo hotel early in the morning to bring you to <u>Bahariya Oasis</u>, which is around 360 kilometers east of Cairo. We pause for lunch in Bahariya Oasis after nearly four hours of travel. Proceed to El Haize (St. George Oasis) and the Black Desert.

After that, take a trip to Crystal Mountain to see the quartz crystal and the <u>Valley of Agabat</u> to see the stunning geological structures.

Proceed till you arrive to Egypt's most famous desert site, the <u>White Desert</u> National Park. There are more strange and beautiful wind-carved rock formations in this desert than in any other place in the globe, like gigantic mushrooms or stones.

Next, based on the likelihood, stay the night at the hotel or set up camp in the White Desert.

Meals: Breakfast, Lunch.

Day 4: Bahariya Oasis

Travel to Bahariya Oasis after breakfast at the campground to explore the <u>Tombs of the Nobles</u>, two aristocratic tombs from the 26th dynasty that are part of a vast burial complex, and the <u>golden mummy</u> exhibition chamber. After that, you'll enjoy trekking up Black Mountain. Savor lunch at the Bahariya oasis before returning to Cairo.

Meals: Breakfast, Lunch.

Day 5: Fayoum Oasis

You will be picked up by a driver from your Giza or Cairo lodging after your breakfast and driven to <u>Fayoum</u>, the location of the Fayoum Oasis.

We will start by going to The Kom Aushim Museum, which is The museum is a fantastic site to obtain guides for the entirety of Fayoum. Construction of the Museum began in 1974. It has Fayoum in addition to relics from the Prehistoric to Roman eras. picture

Karanis (The Lord's Town) is one of the greatest Greco-Roman towns in the Fayoum.

The King who was buried with all of his wealth and treasure in a wadi will be honored by having lunch on Qarun Lake.

Following that, we'll go to <u>Wadi El Rayan</u>, a depression that is 42 meters below sea level and stretches 673 kilometers, and Waterfall.

This dip became a reservoir for water in 1966 when it was linked to <u>Qarun Lake</u> by subterranean pipelines. Drive to Cairo after spending time visiting the Lake.

Meals: Breakfast, Lunch.

Day 6: Cairo - Alexandria sightseeing

An agent from Cairo Top Tours will come to your Cairo hotel at seven in the morning to take you on an amazing day trip to Alexandria after your breakfast. Visit the <u>Bibliotheca Alexandrina</u> first, which is a prominent library and center of culture on the Mediterranean coast.

Next, visit the Royal Jewelry Museum in Zizenia, and then have lunch at a local restaurant. When your first day in Alexandria is over, your guide will take you to your accommodation.

Meals: Breakfast, Lunch.

Day 7: Alexandria tour - Cairo

After take your breakfast, our guide will get you up from your accommodation so you may start a fresh day at <u>Pompey's Pillar</u>, which was constructed in honor of Emperor Diocletian at the end of the fourth century. When it was first constructed, the Serapis temple was an equally magnificent structure to the Soma and the Caesarean.

The next destination you should drive to see is the <u>Catacombs of Kom el Shoqafa</u>, the largest Roman cemetery. Three tiers are carved out of the rock.

After lunch at a neighborhood restaurant in Alexandria, you'll visit the <u>Qaitbay Citadel</u>, built on the site of a previous lighthouse belonging to a pharaoh. then head back to your accommodation in Cairo.

Meals: Breakfast, Lunch.

Day 8: Alexandria to El-Alamain

At 7:00 in the morning after your delicious breakfast, our knowledgeable tour guide will come to your Alexandria accommodation and drive you to El-Alamein, which is 106 kilometers west of Alexandria and 240 kilometers northwest of Cairo. Your first destinations on your sightseeing trip after arriving in El-Alamein should be the war museum and the cemetery, also called the Commonwealth Cemetery, which is home to the graves of soldiers from numerous countries who died in the battle.

El-Alamein was one of the most important sites during the Second World War, known as " <u>El Alamein War Cemetery</u>" thus on this trip, you will get the chance to learn more about it and other pertinent historical events from our experienced tour guide.

We'll then begin the drive to your lodging in Marsa Matruh after that.

Meals: Breakfast, Lunch.

Day 9: Marsa Matruh - Siwa

After breakfast, we depart for the Mediterranean coast of Egypt, Marsa Matrouh, after meeting with our tour guide. Many people think that <u>Cleopatra</u> herself bathed in Marsa Matrouh because of its immaculate white sand beaches and serene seas. We're having a dip in the Mediterranean Sea and spending the night at the Ghaliet Ecolodge & Spa, Siwa hotel.

Meals: Breakfast, Lunch.

Day 10: Siwa Oasis

There's a hotel breakfast provided. At 7:00 am, the hotel is picked up. First up, the <u>Alexander the Great</u> <u>Temple</u>, sometimes referred to as the Temple of the Oracle. Alexander the Great is said to have consulted the Siwan oracle to confirm that he was Zeus' son. The Greek god of creation, proceed to the saline lake next. Not a great swimmer is needed to float in the briny sea. When swimming, use caution and keep the water out

of your eyes. Choose the lake that is the cleanest; you can know it is the purest when you can see the bottom.

Proceed to Cleopatra's bath, The Spring of the Sun, next. Legend has it that Cleopatra once swam here.

Stop for lunch at a Siwan eatery and have some Siwanie food.

Then we take you back to the Siwa Hotel for an overnight stay.

Meals: Breakfast, Lunch.

Day 11: Siwa Oasis tour

We're going to the Great Sand Sea after breakfast. Explore the desert in a Jeep 4x4 and try sandboarding for an exciting experience. The greatest sand dunes in Egypt for sand surfing are here, in the <u>Great Sand Sea</u>, near Siwa Oasis.

After that, visit Bir Wahed's hot and cold springs and have some traditional Bedouin tea after nightfall.

We set up our camp, lunch and accommodation at a Swia hotel for the night.

Meals: Breakfast, Lunch.

Day 12: Final departure

After eating breakfast, proceed to Cairo's international airport to board your flight, which will signify the ending of our services.
