Day 02: Visiting the Memphis pyramid

After your breakfast in the hotel, our certified tour guide will meet you in the lobby in the morning to start your visit to the city of Memphis, The Memphis Pyramid, also known as the Great Pyramid of Memphis, is an ancient pyramid located in the Egyptian city of Memphis. Standing at over 140 meters tall, the Memphis Pyramid was once one of the tallest structures in the world.

One of the most popular attractions at the Memphis Pyramid is the Sphinx, a large statue that guards the entrance to the pyramid. you can also see the remains of the burial chambers and other artifacts that have been uncovered at the site.

Day 03: The National Museum of Egyptian Civilization

There in the Suez Canal, you can watch ships passing through it from observation points along the canal's banks. There are also boat tours available that offer a closer look at the canal and its operations. Afterward, you will enjoy a seafood lunch before being chauffeured back to Cairo.

Day 04: visiting in Alexandria: Kom Ash Shoqafa, Pompey pillar, Bibliotheca Alexandria, Citadel of Qaitbay, and Sidi Morsi Abu al-Abbas Mosque.

After breakfast, get set to meet your expert English-speaking Egyptologist guide to start the day tour to Alexandria from Cairo during our Egypt Classic Tours. On this day, you will be at one of the most attractive sites and unique ones in Alexandria its <u>catacomb of kom el shoqafa</u>, The catacomb entrance begins with a spiral staircase surrounded by a circular shaft that is lowered by ropes to their final resting place. The tombs there in the roman style consists of more than one level cutting under the ground this style was used by the Christians in time of persecution.

following a revolt in Alexandria, the most famous site known as <u>Pompey's Pillar</u>, constructed in 297 B.C to celebrate the victory of a Roman emperor named Diocletian (who ruled Rome between 284 and 305 B.C and also took control over Egypt)

also, you will visit the oldest center of scientific research in history <u>The Bibliotheca of Alexandria</u>. which once was the largest in the world. Located in the city that gives it its name, facing the Mediterranean, it was founded at the beginning of the 3rd century BC. C. by <u>Ptolomy I</u>.

you will drive by the seaside to reach the Citadel of Qaitbay, built on the ruins of the ancient Lighthouse Pharos of Alexandria. It enjoys an excellent position, at the end of a narrow strip of land extending into the Eastern Port.

after that, you will discover Sidi Morsi Abu al-Abbas Mosque: Located in Alexandria's old city, this beautiful mosque features intricate architecture and offers visitors a chance to observe local religious customs and learn about the role of Islam in Egyptian culture.

after all of these sites, you will have traditional Egyptian food or seafood as you like, before going to the Paradise inn hotel to stay a night there.

Day 05: Visit to the city of El Alamein

El Alamein is mainly known for its historical significance, with numerous museums, memorials, and cemeteries dedicated to the battles fought there.
