Day2??: Exploring Madrid City

Explore Madrid's modern vibes by traveling through areas like Salamanca, Gran Vía, and Castellana. In the afternoon, set aside some time to continue your exploration of the city. Day3: Visit Madrid, Salamanca, and Porto

Before we leave for Portugal, enjoy a delicious breakfast at the hotel to start your day. After arriving in Salamanca, spend some free time exploring this amazing city, known for its excellent artwork and architecture which has earned an important spot on the World Heritage list. After we've explored, we'll travel in the other direction of the Portuguese border before arriving in Porto. This historic town, hidden along the gorgeous Douro River estuary in northern Portugal, has been designated a UNESCO World Heritage Site since 1996.

Day4: A tour in Porto

After enjoying a delicious breakfast at the hotel, start the day with a guided tour of Porto. Get yourself in the rich history of the city by visiting some of its most famous landmarks, including the Santa Clara Church, the Stock Exchange Building, and the Cathedral. After the tour, take an interesting Douro River Cruise and discover the famous Port Wine Cellars through a delightful wine tasting. Then You will have the rest of the day to yourself, so you can spend it however you like participating in whatever activities you like.

Day5: From Porto to Fatima

We left for Coimbra, which is recognized as the origin of Fado music and is known for its ancient university, after breakfast. We spent our leisure time exploring this ancient city before moving on to the holy Christian pilgrimage site of Fatima. Here, we traveled to the Basilica and the location of the visions of the Virgin Mary, Cova da Iria. The three shepherds' graves—Lucia, the city of San Francisco, and Jacinta—are located in the Chapel of the Visions, which we discovered inside the sanctuary. We were able to participate in the candlelight processions as night fell. The hotel was our place to stay for the night.

Day6: Explore Fatima, Batalha, Nazare, Alcobaça, and Lisbon

After breakfast, we set out for Coimbra, one of Europe's greatest academic centers, through to one of the oldest universities on the European continent and the origins of Fado music. After that, we had some free time to explore before moving on to Fatima, a revered pilgrimage site and an important Christian destination. Here, we saw the Cova da Iria, the location of the claimed look of the Virgin Mary, and were amazed at the beauty of the Basilica. We also made stops at the Chapel of the Apparitions and the tombs of Lucia, Francisco, and Jacinta, the three shepherds. We were able to take part in the moving candlelight procession as evening approached. Our lodging for the night will be a hotel.

Day7?: Tour in Lisbon

Take a tour of the historic city of Olissipo after breakfast. See the Belen Tower, the Jeronimos Monastery, the Coach Museum, the Monument to the Discoverers, the Marquis of Pombal Square, and Liberty Avenue as you meander through the city's main squares, roads, and avenues. Enjoy free time later in the day to wander the charming lanes of the Alfama Quarter and its castle. The area is home to historic buildings tucked away in lively, small streets that are home to real "tabernas," or taverns." In a neighborhood rich in culture, join your fellow travelers for a traditional Portuguese dinner at one of the city's oldest Fado venues.

Day8: A visit to Lisbon, Caceras, and Cordoba

We will pass through the Andalusian soil and return to Spain after eating breakfast at the hotel. We travel to Caceres, which was chosen as a World Heritage site because of its distinctive architecture, which combines Northern Gothic, Roman, Islamic, and Italian Renaissance styles. We tour the city's Old Town, which has a well-known Mediaeval Quarter, and Plaza Mayor. Next, we traveled to Cordoba, which was the Caliphate's former capital.

Day9: A tour between Cordoba and Seville

Enjoy an excellent breakfast at the hotel to start the day. After that, take a fascinating tour of Cordoba's Mosque (admission included) and visit other locations that will let us unwind and find peace as we meander through the Jewish Quarter's narrow, winding streets. Proceed to Seville in the afternoon on your way there.

Day10: Exploring Seville

After an enjoyable breakfast at the hotel, begin your day with a morning tour of Andalusia's capital, Seville. In between seeing the locations of the Carmen myth and the story of Don Juan in the Santa Cruz

neighborhood, you will have the opportunity to explore the second-largest Catholic church in the world, after Saint Peter's in Rome. The Plaza de España and Maria Luisa Park are also accessible to you. You will then have the afternoon to yourself to explore the city of light.

Day 11: A trip between Seville, Ronda, and Costa Del Sol

After breakfast at the hotel, we will travel south through typical Andalusian towns and villages till we reach Ronda. We can make the best of the chance to explore this Celtic-inspired town and take in the breathtaking views of the surrounding mountains and valleys. Next, we'll head to LA Organic, a nearby Almazara, for a genuine Olive Oil Encounter. We'll enjoy their production of organic olive oil while strolling around their plantations of olive trees. Day12: Cost del sol

Day13: An exploring tour between Costa Del Sol, Tarifa, Tangier, and Casablanca

Day14: A visit between Casablanca and Marrakech

The day starts with a guided tour of the Hassan II Grand Mosque, Nations Square, and Anfa Boulevard following breakfast at the hotel. After that, we travel to Marrakech, an oasis situated between areas that were once desert and the Atlas Mountains. After arriving, we will take in the sights of the city, such as the Bay Palace, the Sardines Tombs, the Koutoubia Tower, and the Giralda Twin Tower. We will also take a stroll through the souks, medina, and Jma El Fna Square, which is an outdoor theatre populated by dancers, acrobats, fortune tellers, and snake charmers.

Day15: Travelling between Marrakech, Rabat, Meknes, and Fez

First, We will leave early in the morning to travel to Rabat, the capital of the country, after breakfast. After that, We will be going to see the outside view of the Hassan Tower, the Mohamed V Mausoleum, and the Royal Palace. Then our next visit is the Mausoleum of Moulay Ismail, the one and only mosque in Morocco that admits non-Muslims, and the Walls of Bab el Mansour in the Imperial City of Meknes. And Once we get to Fez, we'll have dinner.

Day16: A trip to Fez

At the hotel, have breakfast to start your day. After that, began on a morning sightseeing tour of the most historic and significant of the Imperial Cities, including stops at the Jewish Quarter, the Bab Bou Jelous gateway, the seven entrances of the Royal Palace, and a walking tour of the "Medina" (Old City), which is recognized as a World Heritage Site. You are free to spend the afternoon however you would like. We will stay the night at the hotel and have dinner there. An evening meal and show are optional.

Day17: Fez, Tangier, Tarifa, and Costa del Sol

Continue to Tangier after eating breakfast at the hotel. Then Keep going to the pier to board the ship that will return you to Spain through the Gibraltar Strait. Then take a car to the Costa del Sol.

Day18: A day tour in Costa Del Sol

After enjoying breakfast at your hotel, spend your free day exploring the fantastic beaches in the Costa del Sol and the surrounding areas. Sleeping in the Costa del Sol.

Day19: From Costa del Sol to Granada
