### Wadi El Natrun Trip from Alexandria Port

founder of this monastery. Next, move on to the Abu Maqar Monastery, which is the richest owing to its large farm that has 600 workers and over 100 monks. The last stop of your tour will be the least spacious and the most tightly constructed of all the four monasteries, the El-Suryani Monastery.

You will have a chance to shop at any local markets or traditional bazaars that you wish, have lunch at a restaurant, and at the end, we will transfer you to the Alexandria Port.
